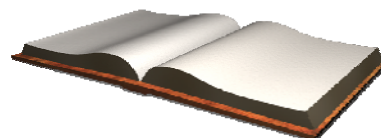

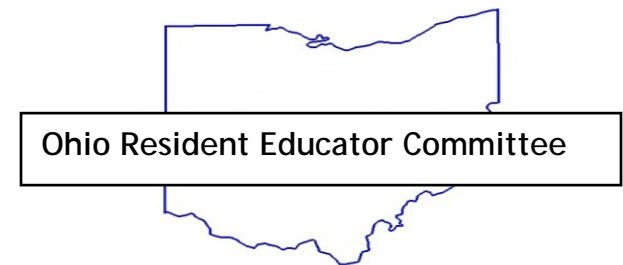
Session 4
